# THE AGREED NATIONAL RESULTS FRAMEWORK AND PROPOSED WORKPLAN ADJUSTMENT FROM 2018 TO 2020

#### I. PROJECT RESULTS FRAMEWORK

- 1. In the process on the project monitoring and evaluation (M&E), the agreed Project Document on "Establishment and Operation of a Regional System of Fisheries Refugia in the South China Sea and Gulf of Thailand" mentioned very clear to follow UNEP standard monitoring, reporting and evaluation processes and procedures. It is also noted that the project M&E plan have to consistent with the GEF Monitoring and Evaluation policy. Regarding this, the Project Results Framework presented in Annex 1, includes SMART indicators for each expected outcome as well as mid-term and end-of-project targets, will be used as a guideline for effective implementation to meet the project outcomes.
- 2. Refers to the clause 197 of the Project Document mentioned that the M&E plan can be reviewed and revised as necessary during the project inception workshop to ensure project stakeholders understand their roles and responsibilities vis-à-vis project monitoring and evaluation. The PCU therefore includes this agenda with aims to consult with Project Steering Committee, in case there is any revision needed. While, to ensure that all participating countries and project partners are aware on the results framework as well as the expected target outputs during their implementation till 2020.

#### II. REVISED WORKPLAN AND TIMEFRAME

4. The project implementation at national and regional levels since started in 2017 till present, mostly are coverage in 4 countries namely Cambodia, Malaysia, Philippines and Thailand that submitted the LOA. It is expected that the remaining 2 countries namely Indonesia and Viet Nam will be starting the implementation as soon as possible after submission the LOA. Taking into account that all participating countries can move together without two countries left behind the workplan, the PCU slowed down the activity during a period of the last quarter in 2017 till the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2018.

- 5. In addition, the sister project on the Implementing the TDA/SAP for the South China Sea (SCS), in which Fisheries *Refugia* project was one of the fisheries components of the SCS project during the first phase (2002-2008), was endorsed by GEF during the end of 2017. This, therefore, is another reason that fisheries *refugia* and habitat linkages are needed to move together to support each other when implementing the project such as baseline information survey, and etc.
- 6. At the Regional Scientific and Technical Meeting held in Trat, Thailand suggested that the workplan and timeframe needed to be revised to ensure the project activities are effectively managed and match to the present situation. This paper reports the revised national workplan, based on the Appendix 5 of the Project Documents, as appeared in **Annex 2.1-Annex 2.6**.
