















Project pilot site in Thailand

In case Thailand, DOF selected Nam Oon Dam, Sakon Nakhon Province is pilot site to be implementing Co-management, from 2014.



Co-management approach at Nam Oon Dam

- 1) Training on Co-management approach
- 2) Baseline survey
- 3) Local communities meeting
- 4) Local workshop
- 5) Implementing on fish catch data by logbook
- 6) Monitoring on rule signboard and logbook,
- 7) Monitoring on logbook and conducted satisfy questionnaire
- 8) Implement and monitoring conservation zone, fish processing and landing site

Training on Co-management approach in Nam Oon Dam

- Measurement to control outsider (illegal fishing) who come to fishing at Nam Oon Dam,
- 2) Increase conservation areas, and
- 3) Remove all bug lift net fishing gear in Nam Oon Dam.



Baseline survey

The objectives of baseline survey was understood situation of fisheries problem, the main occupation, the main fishing gear, fishing time and the main income of fisheries communities around Nam Oon Dam. Baseline survey conducted on 2-9 July 2014, with 139 fishermen in 22 communities around Nam Oon Dam.



Local communities meeting

There are 8 Sub-District of Sakon Nakhon Province located around Nam Oon Dam, with 16 communities. The local meeting conducted on 2-9 July 2014, and 22-26 September 2014. The results of this meeting, there were 32 fishers representatives from 16 communities around Nam Oon Dam.



Local workshop

The local workshop of committee on fisheries co-management in Nam Oon Dam, Sakon Nakhon province, was held during 25 to 26 November 2014, to increase knowledge on fisheries co-management and identify approach to manage fisheries in Num Oon between governor and 32 fishers representatives.


