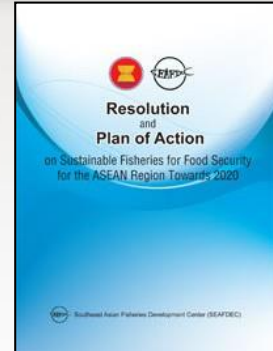

# ASEAN-SEAFDEC Resolution and Plan of Action

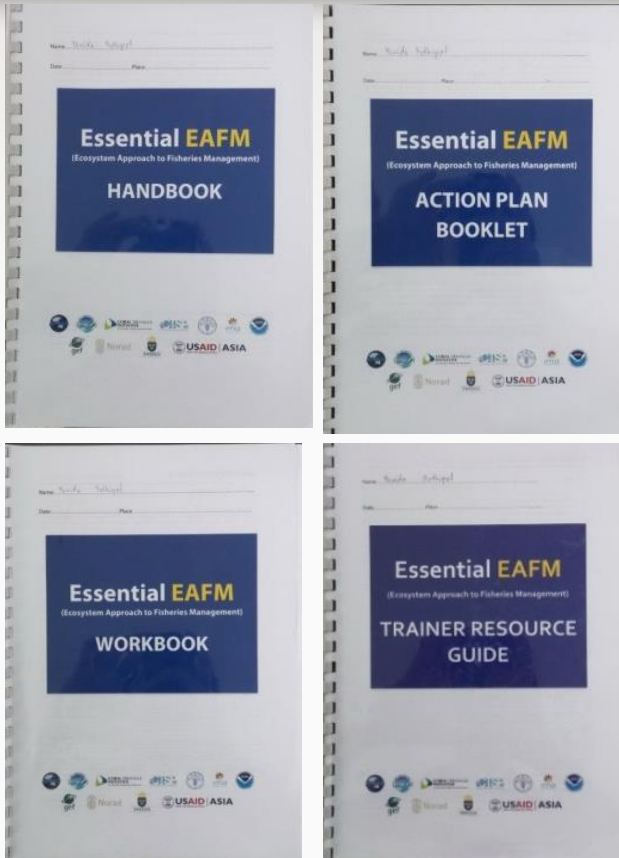
The Resolution and Plan of Action endorsed by the ASEAN-SEAFDEC Ministers and Senior Officials are envisaged to serve as policy framework and priority actions to support **sustainable development of fisheries** and enhancing the contribution from fisheries to food security and better livelihood of people in the region



- Implement effective management of fisheries through an ecosystem approach to fisheries that integrates habitat and fishery resource management aimed at increasing the social and economic benefits to all stakeholders,
- Strengthen the capacity to plan for sustainable fisheries in the context of changing socio-economic and ecological environments through the mobilization of the most up-to-date data and information and the provision of appropriate policy summaries for decision makers;
- Accelerate the development of fisheries management plans based on an ecosystem approach, as a basis for fisheries conservation and management;

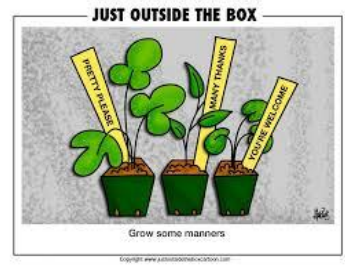
