








GEF Gender Policy...

- O IW and CC Adaptation are the only 2 focal areas incorporating gender sensitive approaches and indicators
- One of the <u>project review</u> criteria for GEF projects is to have appropriate gender consideration in project design and monitoring.
- O Gender in the Results-Based Management (RBM) with appropriate indicators and gender analysis in projects,
- <u>Annual reviews</u> of projects across focal areas are conducted to see how gender mainstreaming has been addressed and integrated in GEF projects through the <u>Annual Monitoring</u> <u>Review.</u>









UNEP's work is guided by the UNEP Policy and Strategy on Gender Equality and the Environment 2014-2017

- It's about gender mainstreaming in both UNEP's operations (e.g. staff hiring) and projects
- It's in line with UN's system-wide policy and standards (UN-SWAP)



UNEP has a flagship gender-environment assessment – Global Gender and Environment Outlook (GGEO) – launched at UNEA 2 (end of May 2016)

The report examines a wide range of sectors and topics, including **food production**; **water and sanitation**; **energy**; **sustainable consumption and production**; **fisheries and fishing communities**; and **forests**.

UNEP has an online gender training course primarily for UNEP staff members but also open to partner organizations








A few examples from projects... words from the PM...

Gender mainstreaming in the Blue Forest project

- O "Our main gender engagement activities are regarding mangrove monitoring and reforestation.
- At our SW site we have trained 20 female 'community monitors' to support the monitoring of the Plan Vivo carbon project in the Baie des Assassins.
- Reforestation is a big part of our work at both sites. We did a blog from International Womens Day in 2015 where we supported a reforestation competition.
- Also, at both sites we have trained women associations as mangrove nursery technicians.

A few examples from projects...

Gender mainstreaming in the formulation of the SAP in the Amazon

- "The 8 Amazon countries adopted a highly participative methodology for the preparation of the SAP, including a broad <u>public opinion survey</u> of the Amazonian society, which informed the development of a shared <u>vision</u> for the future of the basin and its water resources.
- More than 8,700 basin residents expressed their perceptions, expectations, priorities and concerns related to water resources, development, climate change, governance and transboundary issues, shaping the national visions on the Amazon basin.
- 49% of the interviewed were women; the survey reflected the actual local distribution of the population in terms of gender.
- O The perceptions and aspirations of the women population were embedded in the shared vision for the future of the Amazon Basin."











A few examples from projects...

In the Caribbean, the IWECO project talks about;

- Natural resource management disaggregated by gender and socio-economic status (clear evidence of gender-equity in access to benefits)
- Revenue from recycling, small scale farming enterprises, fishing (US\$/yr) (disaggregated by gender and socio-economic status)
- Public Education and Awareness The majority of teachers are female and led the education effort
- Improvement in sanitation facilities benefits female students in particular











A few examples from projects...

In the Caribbean, the IWECO project talks about;

- O Circles of Interest for integrated watershed management were led by women.
- Empowering women by helping them find livelihood opportunities
- In Caribbean SIDS, to mobilize a community means mobilizing women.
