GENDER MAINSTREAMING IN SUSTAINABLE MANAGEMENT OF FISHERIES REFUGIA

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The SEAFDEC/UNEP/GEF Project on Establishment and Operation of A Regional System of Fisheries Refugia in the South China Sea and the Gulf of Thailand consider the gender mainstreaming in sustainable management of the fisheries refugia as one of the critical target outcomes which are aligned with the UNEP Policy and Strategy on Gender Equality and the Environment 2014-2017. The project focuses the gender-integrated activities by considering the needs of women and men engaging in all types of activities defined by the implementation project. These are RELATED ACTIVITIES TO:

- 1. National refugia committee, scientific and technical committee, and site-based management board.
- 2. Development of policy, legislation and management measures, and local government meetings.
- 3. Capacity building, stakeholder consultations, and awareness building.
- 4. Field trips, surveys, and monitoring.

The sex ratio in percent between females and males in each target activity is calculated as the number of women per hundred men engaged in the project activities by year and entered project from 2017-2021. The results of sex ratios per activity of the entire project, as shown in Annex 1, will be discussed at the RSTC6 Meeting for further analysis, conclusion, and way forwards to improve the gender mainstreaming in sustainable management of fisheries refugia in the South China Sea and Gulf of Thailand areas.
